## Following is a list of children & youth services offered by Davis Behavioral Health

### CASE MANAGEMENT

designed to assist C&Y and their families with treatment needs through active coordination, advocacy, linking and monitoring of services

### INPATIENT SERVICES

services for C&Y who are experiencing a level of distress that may result in significant danger to themselves or others. Inpatient services are provided in a secure treatment environment with the availability of 24-hour medical monitoring. DBH contracts with various local institutions. C&Y Director authorization required

### OUTPATIENT TREATMENT

services focus primarily on reducing current behavioral health symptoms and/or maintaining an adequate level of functioning. Treatment is provided in the community, clinic, home or school

### QUEST

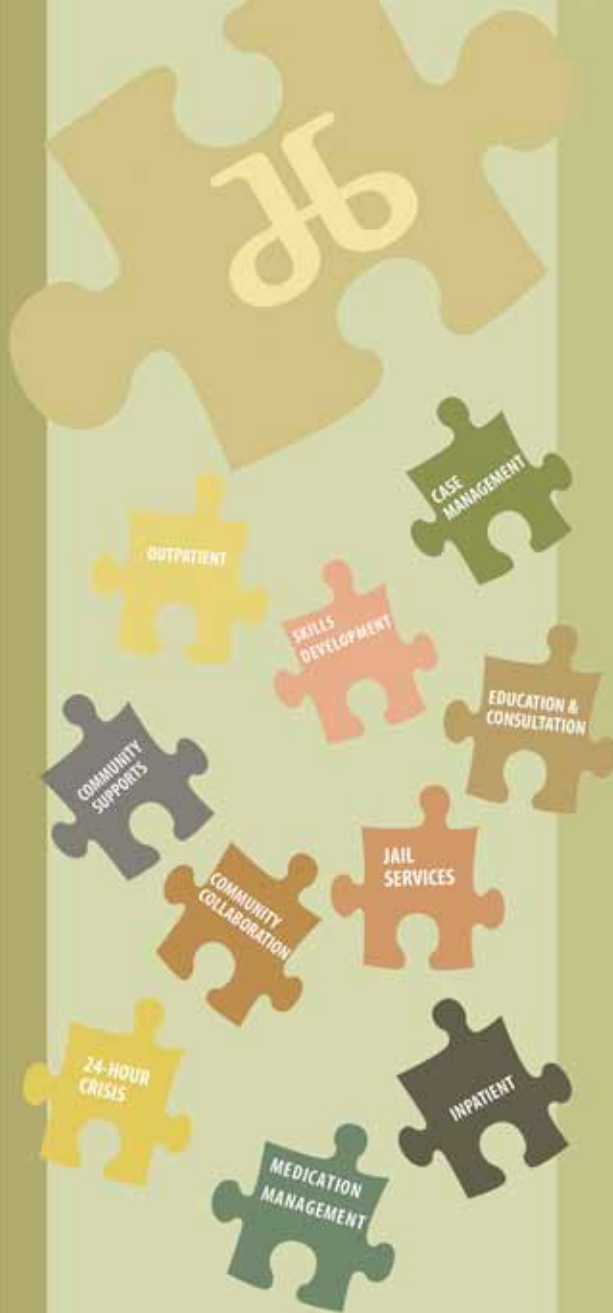
program targets consumers aged 12-18 years who have demonstrated a broad range of maladaptive behaviors such as delinquency, violence, substance use and related mental health issues

### VISION

a sixteen-week program designed to work specifically with each youth/family who is referred through the juvenile court state supervision program. An after school program which may include individual therapy and skills development provided at the home or school

### YOUTH IN TRANSITION

a program to assist youth aged 15 <sup>1/2</sup> - 25 with serious emotional distress or emerging mental illness successfully transition to adulthood and to achieve full potential in life

### 24-HOUR CRISIS SERVICE

the crisis line is a 24-hour service available to the general public

### CASE MANAGEMENT

case managers coordinate, advocate, link and monitor services to assist the consumer with treatment

### COMMUNITY HOUSING PROGRAM

provides transitional and permanent housing for consumers with serious mental illness. Applicants must meet HUD low income housing requirements

### CONSULTATION AND EDUCATION

rapid response to the clinical needs of outpatient primary care clinics, emergency departments and skilled nursing facilities in Davis County

### CRISIS RECOVERY UNIT - CRU

a 24-hour, seven days a week short-term, residential program providing mental health services to consumers

### DAVIS FAMILY ADVOCATES

designed to help consumers access services needed to maintain a substance free lifestyle through case management

### DIVERSIFIED EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES - DEO

provides structured, supported employment for consumers with serious mental illness and/or addictive disease who choose to be employed and are willing to work

### INPATIENT SERVICES

stabilization of acute behavioral health care emergencies are provided in a 24-hour protected environment under contract with various local hospitals. Chief Clinical Office authorization required

### INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT - SUBSTANCE ABUSE

services address more severe problems related to the addiction process

### JAIL MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

provided by a DBH clinical social worker in the Davis County Jail

### JAIL SUBSTANCE ABUSE

a drug diversion program located in the Davis County Jail. Consumers are court ordered to participate

### MEN'S RECOVERY UNIT - MRC

a gender specific treatment program for men aged over 18 years with substance addiction or co-occurring illness

### MENTAL HEALTH OUTPATIENT

an interdisciplinary team approach that engages consumers in a network of support and care in the process of recovery

### JOURNEY HOUSE

a community center available to all people in Davis County with a serious and persistent mental illness. Members are assisted in pursuing a meaningful and productive work, person, and social life

### PREVENTION SERVICES

DBH works with agencies and the communities of Davis County to develop and implement comprehensive systems that create healthy environments in which people can enjoy quality lives

### SUBSTANCE ABUSE OUTPATIENT

provides alcohol and drug services to individual consumers as well as to correctional based programs through specialized contracts or agreements. These include: Davis Drug Court, Davis Drug Board, Drug Offender Reform Act, Plea & Abeyance Program, and Drug Probation Program

### WOMEN'S RECOVER CENTER - WRC

a gender specific program for women over the age of 18 with substance addictions or co-occurring illnesses. WRC provides a full continuum of high and medium intensity care to give women of all walks of life a second chance
